Hundred Review becomes "biggest ever exercise in listening and learning from reception class practitioners"

The Hundred Review, which is supported by Early Excellence, has this week launched a major online survey and a series of focus groups as part of a national consultation seeking the views of early years professionals working in reception.

The Review was opened for expressions of interest in late 2016 with the aim of seeking input from a hundred professionals. The organisers now say that interest has exceeded all expectations and more than two thousand people have signed up to share their views and experiences.
